INTRODUCTION:

Narottam Lalbhai Rural Development Fund (NLRDF) is a Public Charitable Trust, created by The Arvind Mills Ltd. Ahmedabad for the express task of directly intervening in the development process at the village level through specifically designed programmes. Established in 1978, NLRDF started work by 1979 in the Khedbrahma taluka of the Sabarkantha district, of Gujarat State predominantly a tribal area. The present operational area covers 12 districts i.e. Gandhinagar, Rajkot, Jamnagar, Surendranagar, Panchmahals, Mehsana, Patan, Sabarkantha, Banaskantha, Ahmedabad, Bhavnagar, Kheda of Gujarat state.

OBJECTIVES:

The broad basic objectives of NLRDF in rural development can be summed up in the following words:

"Stimulating, initiating and setting into motion a process of development which within a specific span of time would become self-sustaining and self perpetuating, whilst monotonically reducing the relative disparities between various levels of the society".

STRATEGY:

In order to evolve a strategy for the fulfillment of the objective, it was decided to copy nature as far as possible. Since in nature, the various facets of life are all inter related and inter-dependent. It was accepted that NLRDF would take an overall integrated, total-view point in development intervention, at the same time, taking care of the various components that together from the whole.

ROLE DIMENSIONS:

In the light of the above strategy for development intervention the trust carried out operations in various sectoral areas, like agriculture, social and farm forestry, horticulture, fodder development, animal husbandry, minor irrigation, rural electrification (street and agriculture related), roads, biogas, medical services, health care, nutrition, sanitation and disease control, non formal education, vocational training of handicapped persons, watershed development, aids awareness, women and child development etc.

STAFFING:

The trust has a total strength of more than 25 persons, most of whom are in rural areas. Most of them are post graduates in various disciplines related to rural life.

MANAGEMENT:

NLRDF is structurally working under a Board of Trustees, the Chairman of which is directly responsible for the overall policy direction and guidelines for the trust. The present Chairman is Mr. Samveg A. Lalbhai.

Reporting directly to the Chairman and the Board of Trustees is the Executive Director of the trust, who has the responsibility of guiding policy formulation and providing necessary feedback for the same. He is also responsible for the strategic and operational planning of the trust's programme. The present Executive Director is Mr. B.M.Shah.

FUNDS:

NLRDF has so far been funded by the Arvind Mills Ltd. Ahmedabad, to the tune of Rs.9 million. NLRDF has also been mobilizing government and banking funds directly for the beneficiaries of its programme as well as for certain infrastructural activities and other purposes of rural interest.

Village Survey:

Our trained staff had visited eight villages of Palitana Taluka in Bhavnagar District and conducted a village survey regarding present situation of the villages like, schools, medical services available, water facility, balwadi, dairy, people's main business, other source of income, total population, literacy rate etc. Also meetings were conducted with the Sarpanchs, village leaders about their common problems. This report has been forwarded to the Trustees for their support.

Bio Gas Plants:

The most urgent crisis today amongst us is of energy. At the present rate of depletion of conventional energy it will not last more than 50 years, so it is necessary for all scientist and technocrats to foresee the problem and search for the alternatives.

The most promising and easily available source of alternative energy is bio gas. As 70% of Indian population is in rural area, bio gas can be most feasible source of energy for rural sector. Moreover the raw materials i.e. cow dung and cellulosed agricultural waste is abundantly available in villages. So it is at the site energy production and better quality of farm yard manure for fields for individual families.

Village meetings are conducted to make farmers aware of the benefit of the plant and motivate them to go for it. Bio gas plants activities are carried out through Gujarat Agro Industries Corporation and government provide subsidies to the beneficiaries as per their category.

Integrated Rural HIV/AIDS Programme (IRHAP):

Integrated Rural HIV/AIDS Programme is designed to address the alarming spread of HIV/AIDS in the rural areas. The goal of IRHAP is reaching to the rural population in integrated manner and building capacity of the institutions in planned manner so that the villages can effectively respond to the HIV/AIDS.

IRHAP is an integrated approach to respond to HIV/AIDS in rural areas. It involves generating awareness and help in developing safe behavior on HIV/AIDS in general and village women and youth in particular. It also involves advocacy and sensitization of important stakeholders and linkages with Govt. Health services for RTI/STI care, HIV testing and condom promotion. Building capacity of the village level institutions like Panchayat, SHGs, Milk Cooperatives and Agricultural cooperatives is also one of the important objectives of the programme. People with high risk behaviour will be identified and behavior change communication will be carried out with them. All activities of the programme revolve around Communication, Advocacy and Social Mobilization approach.

In Gujarat there are around 1 lac people living with HIV and more than 5600 are registered having AIDS. Further among the total registered cases of HIV, 2/3 cases are in the rural areas. Gujarat state is one of the most industrialized states in India. The developmental pace of Gujarat has brought the villages very close to the urban areas. Many people from the rural area migrate to the urban and semi urban areas mainly for employment. Addressing the rural people in transit is one of the demands of the current time and increasing rural urban mix also increase the vulnerability of HIV among rural population. The studies indicate low awareness among rural population about HIV/AIDS in Gujarat. Now the HIV awareness programme needs to be addressed in the remote areas.

The Gujarat State Aids Control Society, Department of Health and Family Welfare, Gandhinagar, has sanctioned this programme for 3 blocks i.e. Bhabhar, Diodar and Kankarej of Banaskantha district which is high prevalence district.

Objectives:

- 1. To advocate and sensitize important stakeholders
- 2. To build capacity of the village level institution like Panchayat, SHG, Dairy cooperatives and Agriculture cooperative for HIV/AIDS awareness.
- 3. To generate awareness and help in developing safe bahaviour on HIV/AIDS in general and village women and youth in particular.
- 4. To mobilize community for HIV/AIDS prevention
- 5. To increase the availability and accessibility of condoms in the villages.
- 6. To build linkages with Govt. Health services for RTI/STI care, HIV testing and condom promotion,
- 7. To identify High Risk Benaviour people and carry out Behaviour Change communication with them.



Integrated Counseling and Testing Centre (ICTC) at General Hospital, Himmatnagar:

This is a critical point of entry to the continuum of care, support and treatment for all people and particularly those who are infected and affected. It is working at Himmatnagar General Hospital

Economic Assistance to unsupported Widow for their Rehabilitation:

More than 40,000 widows between age group of 18 to 40 years are registered with Social Defense Department, Gandhinagar, who are getting Rs. 500/- p.m. as pension from Government. They want to start some income generation activities for their families as the pension amount is not sufficient for survival, but due to lack of funds and skill they are unable to start any economic activity. Government of Gujarat, Department of Women and Child, Gandhinagar, through Director, Social Defense Department, prepared a very good scheme of economic assistance to unsupported widows for their livelihood and to provide a kit worth Rs. 3000/- to each widow according to their selected trade/business. Under this programme widows were imparted training to enhance their self confidence, quality assurance, management of trades, marketing etc.

During the year 2007-08, total 1350 widows of 8 districts were trained in 54 batches and motivated for their own small business or service oriented skills to earn more for their livelihood.

After completion of their training, they are eager to start their own small business/service but their economic situation is very poor and their sources of loan are limited so they are unable to purchase any equipment/machinery for income generation. Looking to this situation, the department has provided kit of their choice to the maximum limit of Rs. 3000/- so that they can start their income generation activities. On receipt of these kits, they are able to earn Rs. 500 to 1500 p.m. from it. In case of more requirement of working capital, they are linked with banks for this purpose.

Training to Below Poverty Line members for Livelihood:

Conducted training for skill up gradation of the people who are poorest of the poor families with the help of DRDA, (Swarna Jayanti Gram Swarojgar Yojana) Himmatnagar.

Basic Orientation Programme (BOP):

The socially and economically backward people staying in remote areas do not have the information of various schemes of the Government as well as their rights. NLRDF conducted two days training programme for these members where they have been acquitted about various schemes and their rights and duty. These trainings were conducted in Khedbrahma taluka and Himmatnagar taluka of Sabarkantha district. Total 150 women in 6 batches were imparted training under this programme.

Training to Leaders of Sakhi Mandals:

The taluka panchayat of each taluka have formed Self Help Groups (Sakhi Mandals) in the villages but they have not provided any training for strengthening the groups. On their request, we have imparted training to leaders of self help groups for strengthening the groups regarding importance of savings, role and qualities of leaders, book keeping, bank linkages, and scheme on various income generation activities for the groups.

Total 360 women leaders were trained at Himmatnagar centre by NLRDF.

World Food Programme:

The main objective of the programme is to promote income generation activities and thereby food security in a sustainable way through well designed programmes. The target beneficiaries under the WFP are scheduled Tribes people living below the poverty level in the remote area. Women, in a special way have been side tracked, for promotion of developmental programmes though they are the key persons to the socio economic and educational development of their respective families. Realising the key role of a women in the family, various women related activities were incorporated in this programme. The following key activities were carried out during the year under this programme.

Joint Forest Management Training:

Conservation and management of forest of the area will be taken care by the village people. A refresher training programmes was organised in collaboration of Gir Foundation Gandhinagar, and more than 100 participants participated in the JFM training. Now they are active and aware about the importance of forest and its usefulness.

Health Awareness Camp:

To create awareness among the women about health hygiene and balanced diet a camp was organised at village Tandalia and Doctors of Sheth K.L.Hospital, Laxmipura, gave very good information on it.

Exposure Visit:

To give more exposure regarding nature and its benefits an exposure visit of 56 members of SHGs was organised to villages of Meghraj taluka where they discussed with local members about forest conservation, animal husbandry, tree plantation in wasteland and income generation and shared their experience. The members really enjoyed the tour and learnt more about the nature.

Well deepening Programme:

After monsoon the water level in wells has gone lower and it is not sufficient for agriculture. In this programme, 9 progressive farmers were motivated for deepening of their wells. Accordingly we provided financial support for blasting in the wells. They have cleared the debris after blasting from the well. So the water level even after monsoon will be sufficient for agriculture purpose.

Block Placement of M.S.W. Students:

As part of its endeavor to prepare the youth for developmental action, Block Field Work training was provided to the following—six students. During their placement, besides being provided with information, their skills were enhanced for undertaking developmental activities. They were geared for organising training programme and report writing. Their exposure to community development was enhanced substantially by their continuous involvement with local community at field. The students took part in the regular activities of HIV/AIDS, RCH programme, Bio-gas programme, and Youth skill up gradation programme, IRHAP, with the activity coordinator. They also acquainted with the documentation work and different aspects of office management.
