# Narottam Lalbhai Rural Development Fund (NLRDF)

Narottam Lalbhai Rural Development Fund (NLRDF) was set up in 1978, as a Public Charitable Trust by Arvind Mills Ltd. It stands on the principles and philosophy of service to mankind. In the last 40 years of its foundation, it has grown as a grassroots organization striving for holistic development of the rural and tribal poor and the underprivileged through specially designed programmes.

In Gujarat, it has established its credential in the spheres of like agriculture, social and farm forestry, horticulture, fodder development, animal husbandry, minor irrigation, rural electrification (street and agriculture related), solar and home and street light, roads, biogas, medical services, health care, nutrition, sanitation and disease control, non-formal education, adult education vocational training of handicapped persons, watershed development, AIDS awareness and prevention, women empowerment and women and child development and heartfulness etc.

NLRDF reaches more than 5.5 lakhs community people in 136 villages of Khedbrahmma and Poshina Taluka of Sabarkantha District and other more than 20 district of Gujarat 15000 farmers are benefited through agriculture project. More than 12000 widows are benefited under skill development program. This experience of development in community mobilization, project planning, implementation, monitoring and evaluation are recognized as its strengths. Consequently, organizations like UNICEF, University of Pittsburg- USA, Zero to Hero Foundation- USA, Sir Ratan Tata Trust, GSACS, ONGC, CottonConnect, Arvind LTD NABARD, FED BANK, CHETNA and Government departments have been associated with NLRDF.

### Objectives:

Stetting into motion a process of all-round development of people in rural India which within a specific span of time would become self-sustaining and self-perpetuating and as the outcome methodically reducing the relative disparities among various strata of the society.

### Strategy:

Inspired by the nature where the various facets of life are all interrelated and inter-dependent, NLRDF would take an overall integrated and holistic intervention taking care of the various developmental components that together form the whole.

### Management:

NLRDF is structurally working under a Board of Trustees, the Chairman of which is directly responsible for the overall policy direction and guidelines for the trust. He is assisted by the Executive Director who has the responsibility of guiding policy formulation and its effective execution. In addition, the Trust has a total strength of more than 50 persons, most of whom are in rural areas. A majority of the staff holds a Masters in various disciplines related to rural life.

### Funds:

NLRDF has so far been funded by the Arvind Mills Ltd., Ahmedabad, to the tune of Rs. 200 lakh. It has also been mobilizing funds from Government, private agencies and institutions directly for the beneficiaries of its programmes, infrastructural activities and other purposes of rural interest.

# Programmes and Initiatives 2019-20

## Parivartan Project

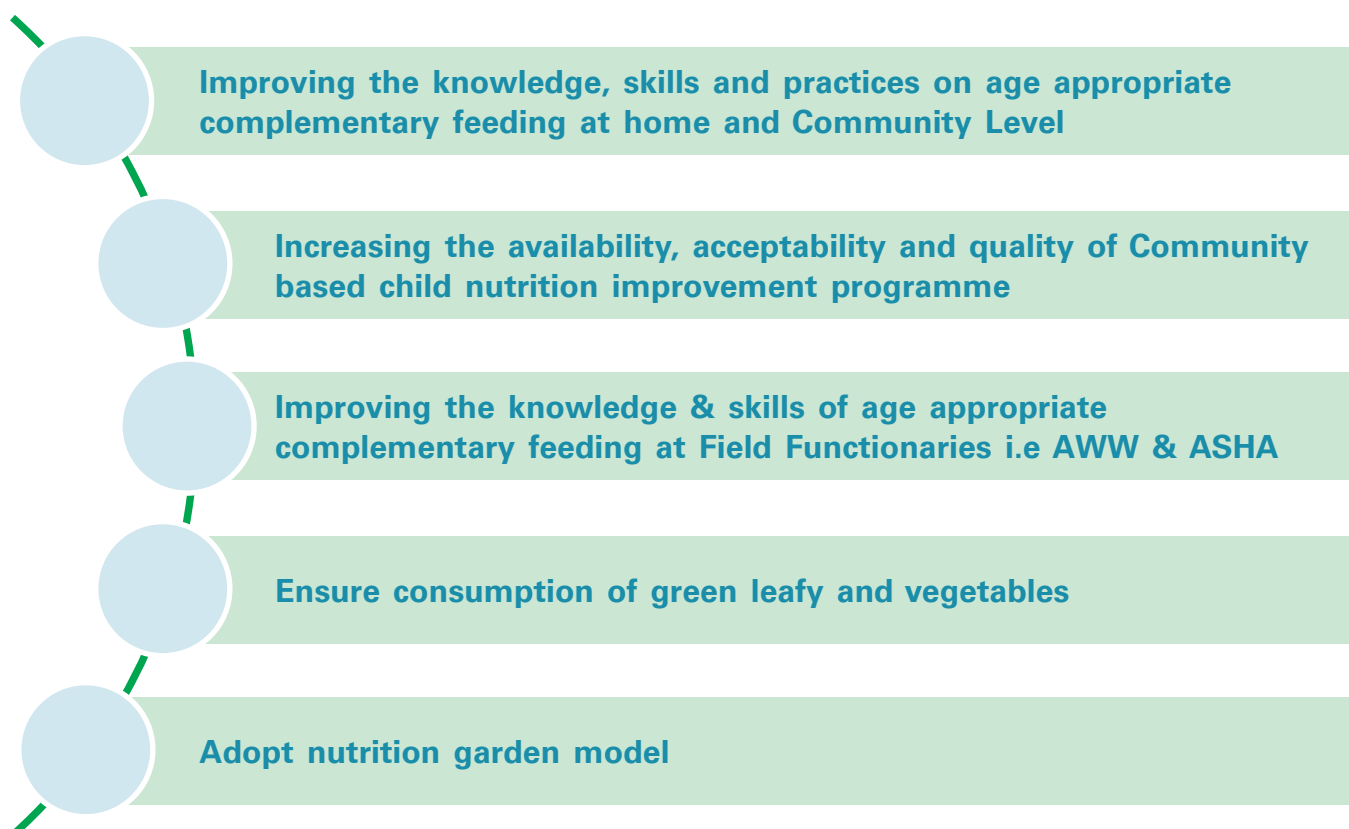
### Project Goal

The major thrust of the trust in near past has been on the transforming lives through improved complementary feeding and hygiene practices at community level under the Parivartan Project.

The project objectives broadly aim at following outcomes:

- Improved complementary feeding practices among the children – from the age of 7 months to 2 years with focus on improving quality of complementary foods at household and community levels
- Spread of health and hygiene practices seeking behaviour change like hand-wash, cleaning of cooking utensils, washing the vegetables before use etc at individual and community level
- Promote family and community awareness on nutrition and hygiene entitlements through participatory communication approaches
- Enhance capacities of nutrition and health service providers, especially Accredited Social Health Activist (ASHA) and Anganwadi Workers (AWW)
- Empower Village Health, Sanitation and Nutrition Committees (VHSNC), known as Gram Sanjivani Samities, for monitoring and ensuring improved nutrition and hygiene/health services especially under NHM/ICDS
- Document and disseminate key processes and learning

The intervention of Child Nutrition component includes:



## Project Coverage

The project broadly covers a community of 100 selected Villages of Khedbrahma & Poshina blocks targeting the following beneficiaries.

- Mothers and care-takers of children of 0 to 2 years of age
- Pregnant women
- Adolescent girls
- School Children – for hand-wash practices
- Service providers
- Secondary stake holders i.e. leaders, PRIs, Teachers, Different Committees in the village etc.

**Exhibition in Mela through display of locally available foods/crops/GLVs used in preparing complementary food explaining the recipes along with the prepared snacks of different varieties.**

**Meeting at Haat Bazar and Tea Points giving messages related to consumption of vegetables, especially green leafy vegetables, seasonal local fruits, locally-grown cereals, Legumes, Pulses etc through vendors who sell these items.**

**Home visits:** 5000 plus families have been covered for inculcating hand-washing practice by creating a dedicated place in the home for washing hands conveniently with soap.





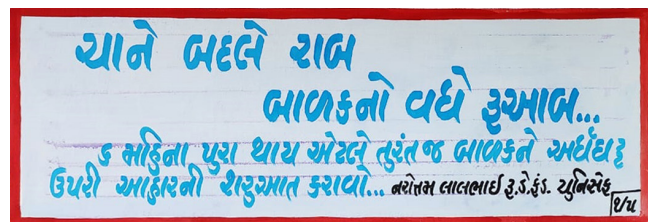
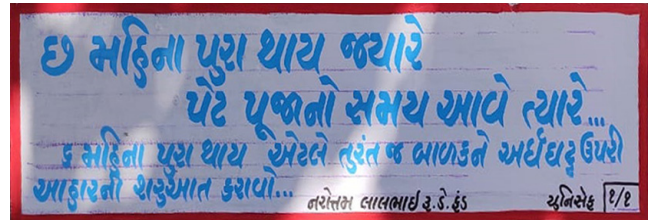
**Nutrition Garden:** 574 Nutrition gardens are developed to encourage the use of locally available diversified vegetables and green leafy veggies for preparing hot meals at AWCs and at schools, under this project to ensure that various local food and green leafy vegetables are available round the year.

**Mother Support Group Meeting:** 207 mother support groups were formed meeting regularly sharing their experiences within community, especially on complementary foods, breastfeeding related issues and solutions, regular growth monitoring and counselling on MIYCN, identification of SAM children, their referral and follow-up.

Counselling session for Children admitted at CMTC centres who need special care at home and proper feeding practices.

**Nutrition Corners at Schools:** Nutrition corners have been established at schools where sessions provide knowledge on nutrition through locally available food. Nutrition gardens are being taken care of by students which help them to enhance their knowledge about nutritious vegetables and green leafy vegetables.

**Wall writing:** At the village level, wall writing has been used as a media intervention. This helps community members to adopt correct behaviours and create enabling environment in community.



**Involvement of College Youth:** College youths are helpful to create enabling environment at the village level. These youths also are motivators. NSS unit of college intervene through various activities under Anaemia free India that are organized with the support of the Health Department.







**Community Meetings:** Quarterly meetings with mothers having children between the age group of 7 – 24 months are organized across 10 clusters. This is a platform for women to share their experience, recipe demonstration from locally available foods, and exhibition. As many as 6,000 mothers or care-givers have been reached out through these meetings.



**Involvement of PRI Members , SHG Members and Milk Cooperative Members as change agents** to make nutrition a public movement. They can easily influence the rural people to bring about the change in behaviours related to complementary foods and feeding practices at households.

## Coverage of 574 Nutrition Gardens by NLRDF made in two tribal blocks of Sabarkantha districts – covered in Poshan Weekly.

Movement of developing Nutrition Gardens has made families in 100 villages in Khedbrahma & Poshina blocks self-sufficient in vegetables for household use.

About 100 villages in the two blocks of Sabarkantha district invested their efforts in setting up Nutrition Garden with the support of Narottam Lalbhai Rural Development Fund (NLRDF) with the technical input and aid from UNICEF, and reaped its benefits when supply was interrupted nation-wide.

“With a view to improving food habits and meeting nutritional requirement of pregnant women, lactating mothers, adolescent girls and children, 38 demonstrative Nutrition Gardens were created with the technical input from UNICEF and NLRDF. The initiative was launched last year in 2019 at Poshina and Khedbrahma. The encouraging results prompted 88 more villagers to grow such a garden in their backyard or field,” says Mr. Kantibhai Patel, Chief Manager, NLRDF.

Meanwhile, the lockdown provided just the right boost to this initiative when supply of green vegetables was hampered. “So, more people came forward and opted for the initiative. Today, 574 Nutrition Gardens are there in these two blocks spread across 100 villages,” adds Mr. Kantibhai Patel, Chief Manager, NLRDF.

Cluster beans (Guar), brinjals, okra, green chilies, tomatoes, sponge gourd, bottle gourd, long Beans (Chauri), bitter gourd and spinach, fenugreek leaves, sorrel leaves and other leafy vegetables are grown in the Nutrition Garden.

“The popularity of Nutrition Garden has soared since Lockdown. Not just did it yield vegetables when it was difficult to procure, it also created a means of earning for many. Also, it kept people out of vegetable markets and thereby contributed in containing the infection,” says Mr. Manilal Patel, Project Coordinator, NLRDF.

Those who have Nutrition Gardens at home don't stop raving about its manifold advantages. "We are not just saving money,

but also our time as we don't have to go to market anymore. Since we are doing organic farming, the vegetables are more healthy and tasty. Besides, it has created an additional means of earning. Isn't it wonderful," says Ms. Shilpaben Devda, Bodiya nu Talav, a beneficiary.

While there are numerous tangible benefits of Nutrition Gardens, its intangible outcomes are no less. "My younger children have learnt to identify various species of plants, crops and vegetables. They now have a better understanding of biodiversity and co-existence. Thus, they have become more conscious of their surrounding environment," says

Nutrition Gardens have also checked the misuse of water. "Villagers make conscious efforts to channelize their wastewater into their vegetable garden. They have mended their casual ways in which they used waste water," says Ms. Lor Tariben from Mithibili village.

"Our finances had been hit big time during the lockdown. It was the Nutrition Garden that not just ensured healthy vegetables in our thalis but also contributed to our family income," says Ms. Makvana Kapiaben form kheroj village of poshina taluka.

My children used to avoid eating green vegetables. But not anymore! Not that they just enjoy growing them, they love to eat them for those are the fruits of their labour," says Ms. Bubadiya Mamtaben form Dabhipura from Khedbrahma block.

"Nutrition Garden has been a great success, all thanks to ICDS, health and the community. But we want this kind of garden in every household for it is the key to ensuring green vegetable in meals everywhere. Once, households are self-sufficient in terms of growing their own vegetables, it will improve nutrition status big time," says Mr. Kantibhai patel, Chief Manager, NLRDF

# Adopting Government schools in Gandhinagar District for Improving School-built Environment

Fed Bank Financial Services Ltd has taken CSR project "Adopting a government schools in Gandhinagar district for improving school-built environment". The Narottam Lalbhai Rural Development Fund (NRLDF) has taken up responsibility to be local implementing partner for the project.

The objective of the project is to improve school-built environment to make it more conducive, and school campus more educative for school children.

Following are the components in which different activities were planned under the project:

- Digital Classroom set up for k-12 grade students with three years support service, including hardware, content and teacher trainings.
- Developing sustainable interactive plays capes
- Developing mini science activity centre for students of all age groups till 8th grade
- Colour works in priority areas like inside classroom

- Educational painting and charts/graphic etc. in classroom and on walls
- Herbal Garden -- planting, fencing, water facility, etc.
- Fencing of priority side compound wall area.

In each component, students learn something different and they came out with helpful outcomes and effective ways of learning.

## Digital Classroom

Under this programme, the classrooms are equipped with Teach Next device, interactive whiteboard and a projector for display. The server in the CCC delivers the course content via LAN to the classrooms which contains lessons, solved examples, exercises, experiments, simulations, etc. in audio-visual form.

One-day training programme was organized to make teachers to understand content, broaden their learnings and make them aware of technical issues for solution finding. As many as 11 teachers participated in the training from both the schools. During the training, teachers



practically used a sample chapter and learnt how to use it.

### **Developing sustainable interactive plays capes**

Sports plays an important role in educating students as it teaches them to become strong from inside, and also develop a fit and sound body. It is a great medium to keep the mind, body and soul in sync and maintain a balance between work and play.

It is in this context, Anthill Creations was engaged for creating innovative plays spaces at both primary schools. With their help, a lighter, quicker and cheaper transformation of existing spaces available at both these schools were converted into interactive and sustainable plays spaces for children to learn and grow together.

### **Developing mini science activity centre for students**

Both schools didn't have any access to quality science education facility. There was a need to provide few basic STEM teaching and learning materials to both schools to promote quality science education and motivate children to understand basic fundamental of science principles through various hands-on experiments. There was also a need to provide educational materials like exhibitions and charts to know interesting scientific facts, phenomena and latest happenings in their own schools.

In this regards, mini science centres at both primary schools have been started with the idea of providing quality resources to children and teachers which can be used for science teaching and learning. The focus of mini science centre is to provide children and teachers authentic, engaging and relevant teaching and learning materials.

### **Colour works in priority areas like inside classroom**

Conducive school built environment is necessary for children to study comfortably and motivate

them to attend school regularly. Many of rural schools have very good classrooms but do not have proper quality colour inside and outside the classrooms. Under the project, classrooms, veranda and the building were coloured with good quality paints. The colouring made the building look like a new one to attract newly enrolled children.

### **Educational painting and charts/graphic etc. in classroom**

Both schools had very old and deteriorated painting and educational graphics inside and outside classroom walls. These spaces are very good for converting them into teaching and learning materials and creating environment for education. Various concepts, facts and exhibits were discussed with concerned teachers according to the syllabus and from students' perspective. Based on standards and space available, graphs and exhibits were drawn on inside and outside walls of the schools.

### **Herbal Garden - planting, fencing, water facility**

To popularize the usefulness of commonly available and generally used herbal plants and to conserve the associated traditional knowledge for future generations, promoting herbal gardens in schools is a very good teaching and learning tool. This also serve as a live lab for teacher to educate school children about identifying different types of herbs and their uses, including growing them in a garden.

### **Fencing of priority side of compound wall area.**

A fencing wall was built at Bhojan Moti Primary school-2 to protect the school plantations and other assets like plays capes built as a part of project. Under the project, U-shaped 4+2 type barbed concentration fencing work of 280 running ft. was carried out at the school. These steps made the school safe not just from vandalism but also from street dogs and other animals.



# National AIDS Control Program (NACP) Idar, Sabarkantha

NLRDF implemented the project in five Talukas of Sabarkantha district with the support of National AIDS Control Organisation (NACO), New Delhi, and Gujarat State AIDS Control Society (GSACS), Ahmedabad.

Objectives of the project:

- To create condition for behavioural change in the community
- To make them aware about condoms and to plan condom distribution and demonstration
- To increase services for treatment and prevention of sexually transmitted diseases (STD)
- To raise more referral services and linkages
- To provide necessary services to people living with HIV/AIDS in terms of care, support and treatment

During intervention of the project, Organization initiates the following activities:

- One to one – individual and group meetings
- Monthly and quarterly DIC meetings
- Demand generation meeting
- Quarterly crisis committee meetings
- Event program

- Health camp and exhibition
- Advocacy meetings
- Quarterly STI committee meetings
- Monthly PE meetings
- Weekly staff review meeting
- Red Ribbon Club program

The following services were provided under the project

- RMC and HIV testing
- Services to HIV affected people and Counseling

Four health camps in association with Urban Health Centre of Himmatnagar and Vadali were organized during the year. During these camps, organization planned screening services and condom awareness.

The community event was planned at Shamlaji and Bhavnath where 65 KP visited the places, and HIV testing was done on 36 KP at Cottage Hospital.

Facility of shelter and medicines in coordination with Rotary Club, Idar, was arranged for pedestrians for three days on occasion of Bhadarvi poonam. Awareness and education on HIV/AIDS was created among the Pedestrians, besides condom distribution.





Raksha Bandhan was celebrated in the areas of Idar, Vadali and Himmatnagar. On this occasion, FSW from Vadali and Himmatnagar areas tied rakhi to police staff of Idar Police Station, and A and B division of Police Station of Himmatnagar. During this event, the organization held an advocacy meeting with PSI and the team. The organization got good support from Police Department because of the celebration of Raksha Bandhan event.

**Celebration of World AIDS day**

World AIDS Day was celebrated on 1st December 2019 and celebration continued for a week under the AIDS programme with the support Gujarat State AIDS Control Society at different places. The team in the meeting disseminated awareness and education on HIV/AIDS and discussed sexual diseases and treatment with the group.

On 3rd December, an awareness programme on HIV/AIDS was organised at Sir Pratap High school at Idar. The team interacted with the 350 students about HIV/AIDS and sexual diseases and answered the students questions. On 5th December, an awareness programme was planned at Bhuravala Arts College, Vadali. The college students were given awareness and education in different groups of boys and girls and had interactions with them on prevention of HIV/ AIDS followed with a question-answer session.

On 5th December, awareness programmes were organised at Himatnagar high school, Himatnagar. The team disseminated awareness and education on HIV/AIDS, sexual diseases. The students interacted well with the team and got information about different aspects of HIV/AIDS.



## Red Ribbon Club Program -RRC

AIDS is a serious challenge and is as much a social and political phenomenon as it is a concern to medical sciences. AIDS is a silent killer caused by Human Immune Deficiency Virus (HIV). Red Ribbon is the international symbol of HIV/AIDS awareness. It is being worn by increasing number of people around the world to demonstrate their care and concern about HIV/ AIDS for those who are living with HIV, for those who are ill, for those who have died and for those who care for and support those directly affected.

Red Ribbon Club is a movement started by Govt. of India at educational Institutions through which students spread awareness about HIV/AIDS. NLRDF implements Red Ribbon Club programme with the support of Gujarat State AIDS Control Society in colleges of Sabarkantha district.

The main purpose of this programme is to spread awareness and promote education on prevention of HIV/AIDS, including providing information on STD and encouraging blood donation.

It is a platform where youth and students learn to be responsible towards the society and understand how to spread the messages in society. Through Red Ribbon Club programme youth and students are encouraged to

learn about safe and healthy lifestyles. The programme helps them to promote health seeking behaviour and voluntary blood donation. It enables them to become change agents in HIV/ AIDS Prevention Programme. Through this Red Ribbon Club, NLRDF played a major role in control and prevention of HIV/AIDS, through spreading awareness, education and promoting learning and helping youths and students to heighten their level of awareness about HIV/AIDS/STI/ Sexuality and other related issues.

The main objectives of RRC are:

- Spreading awareness on HIV/AIDS by organizing NSS camps, drama, theatre, folk dance and street plays etc.
- Organizing and facilitating voluntary blood donation camps and mobilizing and motivating the youth and students to participate in the programme.
- Helping PLHIV people from discrimination and stigmatization
- Reducing new infection among youth by raising their risk perception through life skill education and creating awareness on sex, sexuality and HIV/AIDS
- Educating youth on situations of exploitations and abuse that increase their vulnerability





- Providing care and support needs of PLWHA and helping them living with HIV and AIDS (PLWHA)
- Increasing awareness on different services available such as ICPC, PPTCT, ART, etc. so that accessibility to these services could be made easier for self and for the community people.

**Outcomes:**

- Youth and students obtained clear and scientific understanding about HIV/AIDS.
- Youth and students are now able to help others and have become aware of the rights of people living with HIV/AIDS.
- Youths and students started getting information and help on STD, other related diseases through phones.

## Sexual Reproductive Health -SRH

### Objective

To emphasize safe and healthy sexuality and reproductive health, general wellbeing of people living with HIV, making lives longer, healthier, more productive, and more satisfying.

NLRDF implements the project with the support of UNFPA and under the leadership of CHETNA. The Organization provides information and education to MSM and FSW on safe and healthy sexuality and reproductive health, and helps them to get services.



The project covers FSW of Idar, Vadali, Khedbrahmma and Himmatnagar. The Organization create awareness and provide education to prevent infection of reproductive health, cervical cancer and care.

Total 8 PE meetings were held during the year, and 2 meetings were held with TI staff. Representatives from CHETNA organization also visited the field areas of organization.



# National Aids Control Programme – NACP at Dahej, District-Bharuch

India is a developing country and many of its states are basking in the boom in industrial sector, and Gujarat is at the forefront. In Gujarat, Dahej of Bharuch district has become the hub of industrial units. This place has large number of migrants and they are more likely to get HIV / AIDS. NLRDF is active in this area and intervenes in the HIV/AIDS programmes since 2013, covering more than 10000 migrants.

This project helped to scale up the reach-out to the targeted population groups. The interventions under this programme included:

- The provision of behaviour change interventions to increase safe practices, testing and counselling, and adherence to treatment, and demand for other services
- The promotion and provision of condoms to HRG to promote their use in each sexual encounter; Provision or referral for STI services, including counselling and services for treatment

## Organization has taken up following activities:

- According to the process, 10 to 12 migrants are mobilized and are given awareness and

education on HIV/AIDS while conducting IPC Meetings

- HRB is identified by the process of IPC, and its registration is done by counsellors. Counselling is provided by the counsellor as required and services are provided to the migrants accordingly.
- As per the target, 20 health camps are conducted every month wherein HRB as well as people are screened and checked. STI related medicine is available through GSACS while medicine for common diseases is also provided by the organization at a nominal cost. Community-based screening services are also provided at the health camps. The migrants who need RPR (syphilis test) testing are also taken for ICTC testing at the institute's own expense.
- Demand generation activity has been conducted considering the agenda like HIV / AIDS, ICTC testing, STI, awareness on condom, etc. among the migrants. After ten days of the programme, the team plans for follow up to monitor and assess the progress.
- In the PE meeting and training, a local person was identified as P.E, and helps them to





understand the HIV/AIDS related information, benefits of testing and health camps. Generally P.E is trained and guided by ORW, Counsellor and PM.

- Migrant workers come to Drop In Center (DIC) to get refreshed and for counselling. Registration of HRB is done here and services are provided.
- Video shows were conducted during counselling, IPC program, DIC meetings. The video shows create awareness and education on HIV/AIDS, treatment, services and condom promotion.
- The organization planned street plays to generate and disseminate awareness and education among people on HIV/AIDS. This activity was very helpful to develop understanding and to be sensitized on HIV/AIDS.
- There is possibility of getting HIV for migrant workers who do not use condoms. To avoid such situations, organization has arranged condom distribution programme to provide condom at low cost to the migrant workers.

- Migrant workers find it difficult to go for HIV testing at the centre during their working hours, so the organization started Community Based Screening (CBS) services. HIV testing is done on the field and in health camp. This helped migrant workers easily access HIV testing in the time-saving manner. Now number of migrant workers has increased and so is HIV testing.

- Public places like entrance of the village, stalls, shops, gardens are called congregation points where migrant workers gather. The Organization conducts congregation events at such points and disseminates awareness on HIV/AIDS and condom promotion.

Coordination with company and govt. department

The organization conducted street play in association with RNTCP Bharuch and Filatex Company. The street play helped people to understand about HIV/AIDS, Tuberculosis (TB) and importance of cleanliness. The organization planned congregation event in which IEC activity was organized at the Haat bazaars and places where a large number of people meet and took advantage of it.





The Organization prepared IEC materials with its own name, address and number so that the community can not only acquire knowledge but also easily contact the organization when required.

By the permission of railway station superintendent, HIV / AIDS prevention programme at Bharuch railway station was conducted and the media of Bharuch District took reported it.

The Organization in association with Help Age India and Adani Company organized health camps and provided medicines to the migrant workers free of cost. ELM was done in

association with Aarti Industries to strengthen the project and provide services at large level. TB training for TI NGOs staff was conducted by RNTCP. Team of NLRDF – Dahej, DST MIGRANT and DST CC participated in the training. During training, participants received information about the disease of TB, including the causes of spread and steps for prevention.

The participants were given information and awareness for cases of HIV/AIDS patients having TB and also on one window. The training was interactive and helpful and the participants received useful information and education through this training.

NLRDF planned the congregation event by focusing on migrant workers of Uttar Pradesh and Bihar. This event was followed by Nand Mahotsav celebrations. The event was held at Jay Colony where about 800 migrant workers who migrated from Uttar Pradesh and Bihar reside. Large Number of migrant workers participated in the event. Enable Environment – a component of TI was tested during this event. The event witnessed distribution of IEC materials, exhibition of posters, education on condoms, and information sharing on the 1097 helpline.



## World AIDS Day Celebration – Dahej, Bharuch

World AIDS Day on 1 December brings together people from community to raise awareness about prevention of HIV/AIDS and demonstrate international solidarity to take action against the epidemic. It has become one of the most influential platforms and a key opportunity to raise awareness.

One of the objectives of World AIDS Day is to create awareness and education on prevention of HIV/AIDS.

NLRDF, with support of National AIDS Control Organization and Gujarat AIDS Control Society (GACS), implements prevention of HIV/AIDS project focusing on migrant workers in industrial area of Dahej of Bharuch District. For celebration of World AIDS Day, the organization starts run up to the World AIDS Day celebrations from 30th November.

NLRDF observes week day celebration of World AIDS Day. NLRDF, in association with RNTPC, Bharuch and BDNP Plus, distributed red ribbons and IEC materials to the people and disseminated awareness on prevention of HIV/AIDS. Since its inception in 1988, World AIDS Day is celebrated after the consultation of foremost global health organizations. To mark the event across the globe, HIV/AIDS activists wear a red ribbon which is a symbol of solidarity and support towards the people living with HIV. The Organization, in association with Filotex Company, planned street plays at public places in Dahej. On the occasion, Creation Group performed street plays on the theme of HIV/AIDS, tuberculosis and Swachhta Abhiyan.

The organization conducted talks with the migrant workers of different companies like Wellspun, Lubrizol, Adama. During these talks, Creation Group spread awareness on prevention of HIV/AIDS, tuberculosis and Swachhta Abhiyan. As part of the event,

the organization distributed red ribbons and IEC materials to the migrant workers. The Counsellors also distributed condoms among the migrant workers and explained them why using a condoms is an absolute necessary.

Health camps were organized at BSI and Desai Colony. During the camps, posters were exhibited and blood testing were conducted. World AIDS Day and Anti-Corruption Day were celebrated at the Government School, Suva.

# Better Cotton Initiative (BCI) Project

NLRDF implements the BCI project with the support of Cotton Connect in 22 villages of Khedbrahmma Taluka and 15 villages of Vadali Taluka of Sabarkantha District. Total 4501 (2312) farmers from Khedbrahmma and 2180 farmers from Vadali who have 0 to 20 hectare land get benefits under this project. About 10061 acre of land are covered under this project.

The main objectives of the project are:

- To control pollution and protect the environment
- To reduce cost in farming and increase income
- To improve health of the farmers
- To improve soil

In the beginning of the programme, training of trainer (TOT) was planned for the organisational team focusing on the importance and process of BCI. The emphasis in the training was on principles such as...

- Crop protection
- Water
- Soil protection

- Quality of cotton
- Crop management
- Biodiversity

TOT was given by representatives from Krushi Vigyan Kendra (KVK), and participatory rural appraisal (PRA) was planned in the targeted villages thereafter. The PRA covered the following agendas: Water Resources, Natural Resources, Seasonal Labour, etc.



During the training, the participants learnt about PRA, project cycle and importance of stakeholders. They also learnt about terminology of development and growth, and the process of preparing, disseminating IEC and importance of IEC at the grassroots level.



They also learnt about how to use their skills, knowledge and different tools in the field.

The project provides guidance to farmers about farming in different seasons. In the beginning, FF provides information and understanding to the farmers about preparing land, selection of seeds, precautions to be taken during cultivation and inter-cropping. The farmers also learnt about maintaining farmer field book. Necessary IEC materials were also distributed to the farmers.

In February, the programme is evaluated where farmers share their feedback and enumerates the benefits of it. The farmers understood the following major advantages of BT cotton:

- Use of BT cotton reduces use of pesticides, resulting in reducing the cost of cultivation.
- It results in improvement of yield levels and also improves margin of profit for the farmers.
- It provides opportunities to grow cotton in areas of severe bollworm incidence.
- It promotes eco-friendly cultivation of cotton.
- It also reduces environmental pollution and risk of health hazards associated with the use of insecticides because insecticides are rarely used for BT cotton.

Along with the project, awareness programs on environment conservation, tree plantation and rallies were also planned. Activities such as essay writing, letter writing, etc. were organized for school children.



## Monocrotophos and PPE Awareness Activities

Organization through BCI project provides information on monocrotophos to the farmers in the remote villages by performing Bhavai (folk art). Farmers were provided information on pests in cotton farming and how to avoid use of harmful medicines in the farming. Discussions with cotton producing farmers were held to reap better cotton produce. During the discussions, environment conservation, conservation of natural resources and biodiversity were emphasized. This project yields benefits to all like Jinar Mill, farmers, labours, workers in printing & tailoring, transporters, merchants and customers. The farmers were explained how sowing prohibited medicines is a criminal offence, and how does it affect our health. As many as 688 farmers from 5 villages participated in the programme.

The programme has created awareness among farmers and helped them understand not to use and produce harmful and poisonous medicines.

## Decent Work

NLRDF conducted decent work programme for the farmers wherein they were given information about BCI project and decent work. They got to know about importance and use of organic medicines, besides learning how to make organic medicines, and how does it help in cotton farming.

The farmers through decent work were made aware of the benefits of the government schemes. They were provided insight and input on the kind of documentation they would need, how to use it and where to procure it to claim the benefits of the schemes.

Information about how to avail the benefits of government schemes and which schemes are run by the government were also shared. The information about how to claim Niradhar



## Farmers' Training of BCI Project



Widow Assistance, Pradhan Mantri Bachat Yojana, Pak Vima Yojana, Pension Na Yojana, Animal Insurance, Jansuraksha Yojana, Kunwarbainu Mameru, Sardar Awas Yojana, Homeless Scheme, Free Toilet Scheme and scholarships, etc. were also provided

As many as 338 farmers from 5 villages participated in the programme.

The Organization conducted training for farmers under BCI project. Following are the objectives of the training:

- To make farmers understand about BCI principles
- To make them understand about PPE demo
- To make them understand cotton cropping patters and reduce cost
- To make them understand about organic farming

In the beginning of the training, Shri Vinod Desai from NLRDF welcomed the participants.

Dr. Samir Pandit – Manager Cotton Connect – interacted with the farmers about crop protection, water conservation, soil fertility, quality of cotton, organic manure and different government schemes.

Shri Samirbhai Prajapati – Agronomist from Arvind Mill – discussed with the farmers the principles of BCI, cost reduction and claiming benefits. Shri Maheshbhai Odd from NLRDF provided information on PPE to the farmers.

Jagdishbhai A Patel, a Scientist from Krushi Sansodhan Kendra, Talod, discussed with the farmers the use of technology and scientific methods to tackle the challenges which would help reduce the cost and increase productivity. Shri Gautambhai Patel, PU Manager of BCI Project from NLRDF, shared information about the project.

Shri Manishbhai Patel – Area Officer from Gujarat Green Revolution Company (GGRC)



Vadodara – discussed the importance and benefits of drip irrigation. Shri B M Shah – Executive Director at NLRDF – encouraged farmers for to adopt better farming techniques. He discussed the negative effects on farming, asking farmers to adapt methods that reduce risks. Shri Nirajkumar Lal shared thoughts on protecting environment by using organic manures and medicines.

Vatsabhai Kacharabhai Patel, village leader of Matoda village, also interacted with the farmers about organic farming and shared tips for better farming by zero budget. Kanubhai Lakum discussed how to make organic medicines for better cotton farming. Vinodbhai Desai from NLRDF encouraged farmers to implement what they learnt from the training.

Total 102 people, including 81 farmers from 16 villages, and project staff participated in the training.

### Workshop on Organic Pesticides

In the beginning of the workshop, Kanubhai Lakum disseminated information about the BCI project being implemented in Khedbrahma and Vadali Talukas.

Then Shri Jagdishbhai from Aanand Agriculture University held a detailed session with the participants and interacted about the cash crop of BT cotton. He emphasized that cotton is very important cash crop and farmers can earn well from this crop. He discussed the use of nitrogen and compost manure, process of using urea, and specific findings of weed infestation in cotton.

Further, he talked about the following areas:

- Process of leaf and flower blossoming
- Importance of weeding in agriculture
- Use of quantity and duration of urea, phosphorus, potash needed in BT Cotton
- How to control pests in BT cotton

He thus discussed advantages of BT cotton.

Shri Deep Shukla from Asar Impex Pvt. Ltd discussed with the participants about agro clean to control sucking pests and agro

charger medicine which invigorates the soil. He shared experiences and studies from other countries. He revealed how he made medicine after trials with 4565 farmers. Agro clean and agro charger both are organic, Shukla asserted.

Listing benefits of the drug, Shukla said that the drug only kills enemy pests, and is eco-friendly. It provides proper nutrition & fertilizer to the roots of the crop, and makes it resistance to pink caterpillars. Both these drugs can be given with irrigation and spray in the crop.

The workshop was ended with good interaction and question-answers session.

# Workshop on Menstrual Hygiene and Management

The workshops on Menstrual Hygiene Management were organized at K K Thakar College - Khedbrahma which was attended by NLRDF, girl students and village volunteers. Menstrual hygiene management (MHM) is an essential aspect of hygiene for women and adolescent girls between menarche and menopause. The aim of the workshops was to train and educate students, girls and women on menstrual hygiene and management.

Shri N D Patel, Principal of K K Thakar College Khedbrahma, and representatives from Shekhani Industries -- Neetaben Shah, Krupaben Shah and Bijalben -- were present for the workshop.

Mr. Vinod Desai from NLRDF, in the beginning of the workshop, introduced resource persons and provided outline of the workshop to the participants.

Neetaben Shah discussed at length the changes that occur during menstruation and menstruation cycle. She also discussed how infection is spread by using household clothes during menstruation and precaution

to be taken during menstruation. She also explained how unhealthy and unhygienic practices during menstruation adversely affect women's sexual and reproductive health and well-being, and deliberated on solutions to tackle these issues. Krupaben discussed menstruation is a naturally occurrence, a physiological phenomenon in adolescent girls and pre-menopausal women. She also explained the calculator of menstruation and cleared doubts about the monthly cycle. Bijaben educated the participants about how to take good care of one's own self during menstruation. She discussed dos and don'ts during menstruation period. She stressed on the need for regular exercise and asked participants to avoid cold drink, tea, coffee.

The participants understood well about the types and usage of available menstrual resources such as sanitary pads, cloth pads, and tampons, etc. The participants were trained and educated about effective MHM practices. About 375 people (275 students and 100 volunteers) participated in the workshops.



# Beauty Parlour Training



NLRDF with the support of The National Bank for Agriculture and Rural Development (NABARD) organized training under Micro Entrepreneurship Development Programme (MEDP) for promotion of self-employment opportunities for residents of Naka Village in Khedbrahma Block of Sabarkantha District. The theme of the 13-day training was to impart skills for running a beauty parlour. About 30 women participated in the training from 4 villages.

Shri Kanti Patel, Chief Manager, NLRDF, and Shri Vinod Desai, Project Administrator, NLRDF, encouraged the participants and shared the purpose of the training in the introductory session. They discussed how the training would help them earn their livelihood and create future opportunities. The training emphasized on gender equality and women empowerment in the society.

Women in rural are also desirous of beauty treatment and they want to avail services of the beauty parlour on special occasions like festivals, marriage, family functions and so on. A majority of women visit Khedbrahma for this purpose. As it is time-consuming and a costly affair, women belonging to moderate means do not opt for beauty parlour treatment owing to its higher expenses. This training therefore empowers rural women and help them initiate their own work in their villages where women can avail the beauty parlour services. It is a win-win situation for both as it

creates livelihood of those offering the beauty parlour services and its accessibility makes it affordable to women customers in rural areas.

The objective of training was to develop skills and knowledge about hair & skin care, manicure, pedicure, beauty treatments comprising casual makeup, party makeup, bridal makeup, eye brows, eye lashes, facial & skin treatments, hair styling techniques and methods.

Theory and practical, both the aspects, were covered in the training.

- Importance of training
- Grooming, Hygiene & Safety
- Basic Haircuts
- Hairstylist
- Facial hair
- Eye brows, eye lashes
- Waxing

On the last day of the training Mr B M Shah, Executive Director, NLRDF, Mr Niraj Kumar Lal, Head CSR, Arvind Ltd, and Mr Naval Kannor, DDM, NABARD, Sabarkantha, were present and congratulated all the participants for successfully completing the training given by NLRDF. He also appreciated the training and distributed travelling allowance and kit by NLRDF to all trainees.

The Overall training was very informative and helpful for the participants. It helped and courage them to initiative their own work offering beauty parlour services in their own villages.





## Masonry Training

NLRDF organized 13-day masonry training under MEDP – NABARD at Khedbrahmma. The training was organized for 30 youths of tribal villages where they were given training on masonry works.

The objective of training was to improve craftsmanship of a mason in carrying out brick masonry and other skills required for mason works.

The following curriculum was covered:

- Introduction and explanation of basic objectives of the programme and its scope
- The basics of masonry practice and building materials, measurement and units
- Layout for masonry
- Methodology for layout of base course

- Basic estimation of productivity and consumption of raw materials
- Planning for materials and manpower required for a day's work
- Thumb rules to estimate raw material requirement masonry

At the end of the training, Shri Naval Kannor, DDM, NABARD, Sabarkantha District, shared details of different schemes of NABARD. He motivated the participants and explained how they can use their learning from the training in the market and how it would help them generate livelihood. He also emphasized on the gender equality, importance of women empowerment and skill up-gradation for livelihood in the society. Necessary kit for the mason work was also provided to the trainees by NLRDF at the end of the training.





## Heartfulness - Meditation



Today society is passing through crisis mentally. The number of rural people facing daily life issues are on the rise as they bear the repercussions of economic and social disadvantages. In this context, NLRDF, in association with Heartfulness Institute, organized 'Dhyannotsav' – a meditation programme -- in Laxmipura village of Khedbrahma Taluka. The key purpose of this programme was to use meditation for a balanced and content life.



Prior to this programme, the organization planned a rally in the village and encouraged people to participate in the programme. The representatives of the organization and village leaders helped make this rally successful. Villagers during the rally received the message about importance of participating in the meditation programme.

Inaugurating the meditation programme, Chief Manager Shri Kanti Patel welcomed the guests & participants with inspiring words. Village Sarpanch, Vice Sarpanch, Panchayat members, school principals, principal of K K Thakar College were present at the inauguration of the programme.



During the three-day programme, a play was performed by Girishbhai Turi that called for use of organic manure and organic medicines for farming. He shared with participants how to reap better harvest with low cost. Shri Kiritbhai Desai from Ramchandra Mission, Ahmedabad, provided insight about meditation and relaxation, and how prayer is connected with inner self. Shri Ajaybhai Solanki from NLRDF also shared about love through story telling. Video shows on mindfulness were screened during the programme.

This programme helped residents understand that meditation relieves stress, brings in positivity in life, inculcates self-confidence, bestows inner divinity and peace and increase efficiency through concentration in work.





At the end of the meditation programme, the participants were motivated to present their learning and share it with others. About 300 villagers of Laxmipura participated in this programme.

### Regular Weekly Meditation Programme:

After three sessions of meditation in Laxmipura, we have planned Meditation session every Saturday morning and evening following the interest of Laxmipura residents. We cover school students, hostel inmates and local community in the programme. The

staff of Narottam Lalbhai Rural Development Fund at Khedbrahma office are also regular participants at the programme which is conducted every Saturday at Khedbrahma office between 4-5 pm.

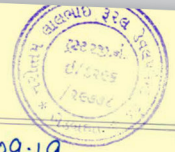



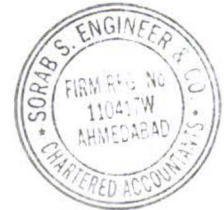
